This is vital as communities depend on us to carry out our mandates as enshrined in the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa and as per other relevant legislations.

Whilst reflecting on the



reminded of the Vuka Mbokodo program during Women month in August, which also started at Ward level and escalated to a Talk Show which was undertaken to address challenges faced by women, with the objective of finding solutions for these as well.

Local Economic Development

With support from Ubuhlebezwe Municipality, our Cooperatives and SMME's were able to create 113 jobs, 58 of those went to females and 55 to males.

During this financial year, we spent more than R350 000, supporting emerging Crop, Piggery, Poultry and Beekeeping businesses, and we are still finalizing procurement processes to support projects for Bakers, small businesses in Forestry, Manufacturing and Tourism. These SMMES are vital for our economic growth and as such, the Municipality is committed to assisting them.

Skills Development

We assisted young people with various skills training programs; which included assistance with drivers' licenses and basic IT. More than 20 young women were trained in advanced baking skills and there were further trainings of both women and men in business management skills and agriculture production.

Moreover, we through our bursary program, we

assisted young people with Bursaries to Tertiary Institutions of their choice. We were also able to accepted 16 interns comprising of Graduates from within Ubuhlebezwe and these interns are currently placed within various departments within the Municipality.

Basic Services

Over the 2022/2023 financial year, we have completed several infrastructure programs such as, 2 Multi Purpose Centres (Madungeni & Plainhill), 5 New roads and several of existing roads regravelled and maintained, 2 Sportfields (Nonkwenkwana & Xolani Vezi), 1 Outdoor Gym, 2 high mast lights and 5 areas electrified (Ntapha, KwaNothi, Makinatini, Nhlamvini, Stofel). We have repaired potholes, re-gravelled roads, repaired and maintened our facilities and to top it all we unveiled our new municipal offices.

By outlining the above I am simply trying to say, we have seen good progress this year and there is still more to be done. To all Councillors; thank you for ensuring that the work of our administration is monitored through the various portfolio committees, let us continue to put the interest of all our people in our daily duties. Our task never ceases for a moment and we must not tire in doing it.

DEBT AMNESTY, DEBT REDUCTION TO RESIDENTIAL RATEPAYERS

UBUHLEBEZWE Local Municipality is embarking on a debt reduction/ discount to all RESIDENTIAL/ HOUSEHOLD ratepayers, by doing so we expect to enhance business relations, attain customer relationships, encourage the culture of payment of services, and improve collection. The council of Ubuhlebezwe Local Municipality resolved to provide this incentive as detailed below;

OPENING PERIOD:

The amnesty period will commence from 01 November 2022 until 30 October 2023 (12 Months Period)

THE STRATEGY WILL BE IMPLEMENTED AS FOLLOWS: FOR RESIDENTIAL HOUSEHOLDS WHO OWE R 30 000 TO R100 000

- * R 30 000.00 TO R100 000.00 Residential Debtors
 - * 5% Discount on Outstanding Debt
 - * A 50% Upfront Payment required
- * Payment arrangement of over 3 months thereafter

FOR RESIDENTIAL HOUSEHOLDS WHO OWE R 100 001 TO R200 000

- * R100 001.00 TO R200 000.00 Residential Debtors
 - * 8% Discount on Outstanding Debt
 - * A 30% Upfront Payment required

* Payment arrangement of over 4 months thereafter

FOR RESIDENTIAL HOUSEHOLDS WHO OWE R 200 001 AND ABOVE

- * R200 001.00 AND Above Residential Debtors
 - * 15% Discount on Outstanding Debt
 - * A 20% Upfront Payment required
- * Payment arrangement of over 6 months thereafter

Customers who will pay their annual rates and service charges (12 Months rates) for 2023 between 01 November 2022 and 30 January 2023 will receive a 5% discount.

NB: The municipality urges all residential customers to take advantage of this once-off debt reduction offer. Should a customer default from the agreed arrangement, the once-off incentive scheme shall fall away.

UBUHLEBEZWE PASSES 2023/2024 ANNUAL BUDGET

OLLOWING community engagements from 11 April to 19 April 2023 across the 14 Wards and with Ward Committee Members, stakeholders and ratepayers the uBuhlebezwe Local Municipality passed the overall 2023/2024 annual budget of R269 686 719 million with an operation budget of R 214 479 119 million and a capital budget of R 55 207 600 million.

The uBuhlebezwe Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr EB Ngubo traversed the length and the breadth of the municipal area during the Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and Budget Izimbizo getting inputs from communities and stakeholders as per the Municipal System Act which compels municipality to annually review-

(a) The needs of the community;

- (b) Its priorities to meet those needs;
- (c) Its process for involving the community;
- (d) Its organisational and delivery mechanisms for meeting the needs of the community; and
- (e) Its overall performance in achieving the objectives referred to in subsection (1).

Presenting the budget highlights during the Council sitting recently, Cllr Ngubo outlined the budget that is aimed at assisting the various communities of uBuhlebezwe while zooming into infrastructure, youth, and economic development.

FIRE DRILL AWARENESS **CAMPAIGN FOR HARRY GWALA DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY**

ARRY Gwala District Municipality held a fire drill awareness campaign which was conducted by uBuhlebezwe Municipality Fire and Rescue Department, the aim of the awareness is to caution employees about possible fire dangers within the work environment and at their homes.

During the awareness employees were educated on how to prevent fire, to put off fire, and what to do during a fire outbreak in a workplace. Employees had an opportunity to learn how to use various fire extinguishers under different circumstances. Each fire disaster can have lasting effects, serious injuries, fatalities, devastating, and costly property damage can occur. The key to fire safety is practicing specific fire safety and fire prevention behaviors. There are

some very simple steps you can take to prevent loss of life and property from fire such as, never lock, or block fire exits or doorways, halls, or stairways. Fire doors provide a way out and slow the spread of fire and smoke. Never prop a stairway or other fire doors open. Learn your building's evacuation plans. Make sure everyone knows what to do if the fire alarm goes off. Plan and practice your escape plan. Make sure your building manager displays evacuation routes in high-traffic areas like passages. Know the sound of your building's fire alarm and display emergency numbers near all telephones. Know who is responsible for maintaining the fire safety systems. Make sure nothing blocks devices and promptly report any sign of damage or malfunction to the building management.

The programme facilitated by the library trained eight people on a monthly basis in Computer Literacy, the first batch started in March and the programme will continue right through to the end of the year.

This programme is undertaken yearly and in collaboration with the Department of Sport, Arts,



and Culture in KwaZulu-Natal under the then "INTERNET AT YOUR LIBRARY PROJECT" through which libraries received computers to assist the public to access and use the Internet for free.

The programme has aided in incapacitating some of the Municipality's General Workers and Security guards.

This programme saw the inception of the Cyber Cadet sector, a sector that assists library patrons with various cyber issues and facilitates training programmes.

The Moses Kotane Institute is an entity of the Provincial Government through EDTEA with a mandate to conduct world-class research into


training, skills development, and provincial strategic economic sectors.

S South Africa rebuilds from the Covid-19 pandemic and amid the effects of economic downturn, the informal economy continues to play a key role in tackling unemployment as well as setting up the country for an economic recovery. It is the government's role to assess how these informal businesses are picking themselves up, how are they coping and what interventions can be put in place in order for them to stay afloat.

As part of the National Informal & Micro Enterprise Development Programme (IMEDP), Deputy Minister Dipuo Peters for the Department of Small Business Development was in Harry Gwala District at the Peace Initiative Hall in Ixopo. Harry Gwala District Speaker, Cllr Mdunge, uBuhlebezwe Local Municipality Mayor Cllr EB Ngubo and CEO of Harry Gwala Development Agency Ms. Whyte accompanied the Deputy Minister.

The Department of Small Business

Development in partnership with SEDA and Local Municipalities provided tools and equipment to informal and micro enterprises through the IMEDP. The IMEDP offers a 100% grant to informal businesses operating in townships and rural areas with the focus mainly on specific targeted beneficiaries such as women, youth, and PWDs. The IMEDP supports informal and micro enterprises by providing them with operational support equipment. The programme strives to accelerate growth of these enterprises by improving their competitiveness and sustainability to become formal businesses in the mainstream economy.

The aim of this initiative was to uplift business owners in the informal sector by providing them with targeted skills development and training, as well as business tools and equipment to assist them to be sustainable and competitive. A total of 24 beneficiaries from across the Harry Gwala District benefitted.



Training programme to upskill males a success













EEDING the outcry for help with skills that would afford them job opportunities from males during Izimbizo Zamadoda dialogues, the Mayor of uBuhlebezwe Local Municipality recently awarded certificates of completion to some of the men who completed the targeted training.

The Mayor, Cllr EB Ngubo, led the occasion of handing over certificates to the male graduates who completed the small business training programme. In the Ladies race, Zinhle Shabalala won the race by running after completing the race in a time of 2:46:13, in second place Mswawenkosi Nsibande who ran-2:58:20 and in third place was Jennifer Koech who ran-3:00:04. Shabalala walked away with R50 000, Nsibande with R30 000 and Koech with R15 000.

Harry Gwala District Municipality Mayor Cllr. Zamo Nxumalo said it was exciting that more participants in this race were from within the District and that more youth participation was noted. "The marathon is growing each year and it is really exciting that more people from this District are entering the race. This year we saw an athlete from Mzimkhulu coming second, we are very happy for him and his family. We congratulate the winners of this race and all those that participated. Next year it will be bigger," said Mayor Nxumalo.

Athletes in this marathon shared prize money valued at more than R400 000. The Race Director Celi Makhoba also congratulated athletes.
